# **Even Nice People Get Lice**

## What you can do if someone in your family gets head lice...

- \*Check the hair of everyone in the house, especially the hair behind the ears and at the back of the head.
- \*Remove all lice and nits (eggs) using a special nit comb or your fingernails. A bright light may be helpful to see nits more clearly.
- \*Check/Comb everyday until you do not see any more nits.

## Just the facts...

- \*Lice cannot live without human contact for more than a day.
- \*Lice cannot stay alive in schools or on school buses over weekends.
- \*Head lice can spread if two heads are close together.
- \*Lice cannot fly or jump! They have no wings or hind legs.
- \*Lice prefer to stay in the hair, not the environment.
- \*Lice do not cause disease.
- \*Pets do not get head lice.
- \*Kids often get head lice at sleepovers, while at group or club activities, family gatherings, babysitting, playing sports, watching TV or playing video games together.
- \*Research shows most children who get head lice do not get them in school.
- \*Lice seem to be more prevalent in schools after a break when children have **more** close personal contact with each other.
